

Invocation

Statement of Faith – Westminster Shorter Catechism Questions 46 and 47

Q47. What is required in the First Commandment?

A. The First Commandment requires us to know and acknowledge God to be the only true God, and our God; and to worship and glorify Him accordingly.

Q48. What is forbidden in the First Commandment?

A. The First Commandment forbids the denying, or not worshiping and glorifying, the true God as God, and our God; and the giving of the worship and glory to any other, which is due to Him alone.
