#### Statement of Faith – Westminster Larger Catechism Question 72

Q. What is justifying faith?

A. Justifying faith is a saving grace, wrought in the heart of a sinner by the Spirit and Word of God, whereby he, being convinced of his sin and misery, and of the inability in himself and all other creatures to recover him out of his lost condition, not only gives assent to the truth of the promise of the gospel, but receives and rests upon Christ and His righteousness for the pardon of sin and for the accepting and accounting of him as righteous in the sight of God for salvation.
